

A WORD ABOUT COVENANT RENEWAL

On Sunday, January 1, as we enter into the New Year, we will once again participate in a traditional liturgy for covenant renewal that emerged from our Congregation heritage among the English Puritans of the 17th century. It was later adapted by John Wesley, a priest of the Church of England and the founder of the Methodist movement. In fact, the act of renewing our covenant with God is deeply rooted in biblical history. In years past, many of those present found this to be a meaningful way to intentionally renew our commitment as Christ's people as we enter the New Year. This year, as always, I pray that this traditional liturgy will encourage you in the practice of your faith in the days to come. That you may be informed and prepared, a copy of the liturgy is included here:

Brothers and sister in Christ, the Christian life is redeemed from sin and consecrated to God. Through baptism, we have entered this life and have been admitted into the new covenant of which Jesus Christ is the Mediator. He sealed it with his own blood, that it might last for ever. On the one side, God promises to give us new life in Christ, the Source and Perfecter of our faith. On the other side, we are pledged to live no more for ourselves but only for Jesus Christ, who loved us and gave himself for us.

From time to time we renew our covenant with God, especially when we reaffirm the Baptismal Covenant and gather at the Lord's table. Today, however, we meet, as the generations before us have met, to renew the covenant that binds us to God. Let us make this covenant of God our own.

Commit yourselves to Christ as his servants. Give yourselves to him, that you may belong to him. Christ has many services to be done. Some are more easy and honorable, others are more difficult and disgraceful. Some are suitable to our inclinations and interests, others are contrary to both. In some we may please Christ and please ourselves. But then there are other works where we cannot please Christ except by denying ourselves. It is necessary, therefore, that we consider what it means to be a servant of Christ. Let us therefore go to Christ, and pray:

Let me be your servant, under your command. I will no longer be my own. I will give myself up to your will in all things.

Be satisfied that Christ will give you your place and work.

Lord, make me what you will. I put myself in your hands: put me to doing, put me to suffering, let me be employed for you, or laid aside for you, let me be full, let me be empty, let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and with a willing heart give it all to your pleasure and disposal.

Christ will be the Savior of his servants. He is the source of all salvation to those who obey. Christ will have no servants except by consent; Christ will not accept anything except full consent to all that he requires. Christ will be all in all, or he will be nothing. Confirm this by a holy covenant.

To make this covenant a reality in your life, listen to these admonitions:

First, set apart some time, more than once, to be spent alone before the Lord; in seeking earnestly God's special assistance and gracious acceptance of you; in carefully thinking through all the conditions of the covenant; in searching your hearts whether you have already freely given your life to Christ.

Consider what your sins are.

Consider the laws of Christ, how holy, strict, and spiritual they are, and whether you, after having carefully considered them, are will to choose them all.

Be sure you are clear in these matters, see that you do not lie to God.

Second, be serious and in a spirit of holy awe and reverence.

Third, claim God's covenant, rely upon God's promise of giving grace and strength, so you can keep your promise. Trust not your own strength and power.

Fourth, resolve to be faithful. You have given to the Lord your hearts, you have opened your mouths to the Lord, and you have dedicated yourself to God. With God's power, never go back.

And last, be then prepared to renew your covenant with the Lord. Fall down on your knees, lift up your hands toward heaven, open your hearts to the Lord, as we pray:

I welcome Christ as the living Way, and sincerely join myself in a covenant with him, acknowledging my own brokenness: hungry, sinful, blind and naked, unworthy even to wash the feet of his servants. I renounce my own worthiness, and vow that God alone is the source of my righteousness. I renounce my own knowledge, and take Christ as my wisdom. I renounce my own will and take God's will as my guide. I do here covenant with you, O Christ, to take my lot with you as it may fall. Through your grace I promise that neither life nor death shall part me from you.

Gracious God, as we prepare to enter a new year, we have come into your presence to renew our covenant to serve in your name, working each day for peace and justice, hope and reconciliation for all your children in every place. In the name of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior. Amen. [adapted from the UIM Book of Worship by BWM]

STEPHEN MINISTRY MESSAGE BY ANITA RIFKIND



*He has made everything beautiful in its time.
Also, he has put eternity into man's heart,
yet so that he cannot find out what God has done from the beginning to the end.*

Ecclesiastes 3: 11

The new year almost always prompts me to think about the passage of time. I have been aided in this recently by watching the NOVA series "The Universe." (And yes, I'm a little behind in my television viewing.) The last one I watched indicated that Albert Einstein's notion that space and time are inexorably linked are about to be supplanted by what is being called the theory of quantum gravity.

The implications of this separation of time and space are a bit mind boggling. First, it means that our notion of time as "an ever flowing stream" is inaccurate. The way NOVA envisioned it was more like a Jell-O mold, where you could pick a spot to take a slice out – either backwards or forwards from what we consider "now." It means that time travel is theoretically possible – no longer merely the stuff of science fiction. (But this separation of time and space only happens at very high energy levels, so don't expect to be able to take such a trip any time soon.)

Second, it likely means that there wasn't a "big bang" at the beginning of the universe, but rather "a big bounce." According to this new theory, the universe is currently expanding, but at some point it will begin to contract until it becomes so tiny and dense that it will explode and begin the process all over again. (By the time that happens, however, I figure human beings will have perfected time travel and will be able to just send themselves back in time a couple of billion years.)

Going back to the beginning, starting over – each new year provides each of us with the opportunity to reconsider who we are and where we are on our journey. This is true for those of us in Stephen Ministry as well. Part of our goals for this year is to reintroduce the program to the congregation by trying to succinctly define what Stephen Ministry is and to decide how to best connect the program to the congregation.

The national Stephen Ministry organization describes the program this way: "...high-quality, confidential, Christ-centered care and support to people experiencing grief, divorce, cancer, job loss, loneliness, disability, relocation, and other life difficulties." This seems sort of cerebral to us, and we are searching for a different way to express what our relationship with the congregation is, or should be.

We Stephen Ministers would like to hear from you. What do you think of the program? Do we communicate what it is we do adequately? Or do have questions about why we exist and what the program is for? Would you like to see or hear more from us? Or less? Are you aware of some area of need in the congregation that is not being met? Please contact Liz Swanson, Katie Reboletti, Ginny Feurer, Marie Clapper, me, Pastor Brett, or any Stephen Minister to communicate your thoughts on these questions.
